ENETERING INTO THE SEASON OF ADVENY

The traditional prayer of Advent, 'Come, Lord Jesus', brings us straight to the heart of what this season is about. The word Advent stems from the Latin Adventus, meaning, 'coming' or 'arrival'. It speaks to our yearning for the presence of Jesus in our lives and to a deep-down recognition for the need of this presence above all things.

At the beginning of a new Church year, over the Four Sundays of the Advent season we ready ourselves for the joy of Christmas when we remember and commemorate the birth of Christ. Advent is also about preparing ourselves for His second coming, at the end of time. We are reminded of this second coming in many phrases that we hear or say at Mass, for example 'as we look forward to his second coming', 'when he comes again in glory', 'as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour'. This second coming is a central theme from the beginning of Advent right up to 17 December. After that point, our attention and preparation move more exclusively to the commemoration of His first coming on the Feast of the Nativity.

And yet, as we prepare to remember his coming at Christmas and to anticipate his Second Coming, we also recognise that the risen Christ is always coming to us. In these Advent days, Jesus, 'God with us', the Lord who is HOPE, PEACE, JOY & amp; LOVE, reaches out to us and walks with us. As we journey through these days are we ready to welcome him again and again into our life? Are we ready to pray, 'Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!'.



A JUBILEE – or Holy Year is marked every twenty-five years by the Universal Church as a time of dedicated prayer so as to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

The theme for the Jubilee Year is 'PILGRIMS OF HOPE'. This theme invites us to recognise the Christian hope that is at the centre of our faith, a hope we carry with us into every experience of our life. It also encourages each of us to be messengers of hope in our very troubled world.

The Jubilee Year 2025 opens in Rome on Christmas Eve, 24 December, with the opening of the HOLY DOOR in St Peter's Basilica by Pope Francis after the celebration of Mass in St Peter's Square. Further doors will open at the basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls in Rome and, perhaps, at a prison. Unlike in the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, holy doors will open in Rome only in this Jubilee.
