#### **Reflection for Third Sunday of Lent**

What comes to mind when I think about the three readings of today is the call of God and the obligation to be proactive with the call. This theme runs through each of the readings.

Today's first reading narrates the story of the call of Moses by God. God called Moses so that Moses would act as God's instrument to bring the people of Isreal from slavery int the Promised Land. But first things first, God had to establish a relationship with Mosese before he could be given this assignment. As with the start of any relationship, God called Moses by name. The symbolism of name-calling in the scriptures is to claim ownership. The one who gives the name is the superior. In called moses by name, God implicitly tells Moses that you are mine and I [God] am your Lord and Master. It is because of this that God refers to Godself as "I am who I am" when Moses asked for God's name. The "I am who I am" is a title rather than the name of God. It is God who can claim ownership to Moses and not the other way round.

In calling Moses by name, God established a relationship of trust with Moses. The "I am who I am" as an attribute of God is a statement of assurance that God will be with Moses in the assignment which he has been given. One biblical interpretation of the "I am who I am" is that God is a God of history. Because I am the God of your fathers in the past (Abraham, Isaac and Jacob), I will also be your God now, but also in future.

Like Moses, each one of us has received something from God. This is the message of Paul to the Christians of Corinthians. The greatest gift that we receive from God is salvation through Jesus Christ. We are challenged through St. Paul to reflect on our response to faith and salvation that we have gratuitously received. The lives of our ancestors in faith ought to be a lesion for us on how we ought to live out our own faith in the present time. St. Paul reminds his Christians and all of us not to be wasteful of God's gifts. The people of Israel experienced many saving acts of God but this did not stop them from apostasy at several times in their history. The gospel reading talks about the tree which fails to bear fruits despite the numerous efforts of the gardener. Perhaps, each one of us can identity ourselves as the tree which fails to bear fruit.

Through our baptism, each one of us has been called by God; God claimed us for himself. Our relationship with God which started in baptism is constantly renewed by the other sacraments of the Church. One way to discern my response to these would be to ask whether I am growing in my sacramental life or not.
